NRIG expresses our deepest sympathies at the passing of an esteemed colleague, a dedicated mentor, a distinguished professor, a strong leader in nursing research and scholarship, and long-standing NRIG member, Dr. Heather Laschinger.



Among a multitude of awards, Dr. Laschinger's contributions to the nursing profession exceeds a list of over 200 publications, including four books and the supervision of more than 100 graduate students and postdoctoral scholars. She pioneered research that explored theory-driven approaches to creating healthy nursing work environments. Her legacy was devoted to learning and scholarship that has helped advance the nursing profession. The nursing community has felt a great loss since her passing. NRIG would like to wish Dr. Laschinger's family, friends, colleagues and students our condolences.

NRIG Membership Numbers

We are pleased to report that NRIG membership continues to grow! From September 23rd, 2016 to January 23rd, 2017 the number of RN members in NRIG increased from 504 to 700. Our student membership dropped slightly from 1111 to 998 student members but overall, our membership increased from 1615 to 1698 members. We will continue to engage lapsed members and encourage them to renew their NRIG membership.
